1. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Good afternoon, students. This is Vice Principal Webster. As you know, our school's new eco garden will open next month. I'm very happy to have a new school garden. Completing construction is thanks to your help. However, our new eco garden doesn't have a proper name yet. So, we're holding a school garden naming contest. I'm sure you'll be proud of yourself if you suggest the winning name. You can participate in this naming contest by clicking the banner on our school website. The deadline is next Tuesday. We'll select the top three submissions and hold an online vote next Friday. The name with the most votes wins. We're looking forward to seeing your brilliant and witty ideas for the garden name!

2. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

- M: Have you finished class for today?
- W: Yeah. But it's really hard for me to manage my online classes.
- M: Why? I thought you were accustomed to it.

M: Hello, class. We discussed the four main instrument sections of an orchestra last week. Today, I'll tell you about how string instruments sound and what they play in an orchestra. The first is the violin. The violin is the baby of the string family, and like babies, it makes the highest sounds. Violins often play the melody in an orchestra. Next is the viola. Violas produce a richer, warmer sound than the violin, and they almost always play the harmony in an orchestra. The third is the cello. Of all the string instruments, cellos sound the most like a human voice, and they can make a wide variety of tones, from warm, low pitches to bright, higher notes. They play both harmony and melody. Lastly, the harp is different from the other string instruments. The sound of the harp is often dreamlike, almost like a fairy tale. It plays both melody and harmony. Now, shall we listen to the sound of each instrument to learn the differences?
